Call to Order

Keith Rogers, presiding, called the Kentucky Agricultural Development Board (KADB) regular business meeting to order at 10:02 a.m. (EDT)

Mr. Rogers received verification from Emily Milam, Public Relations Officer, that the media had been notified of the KADB monthly meeting.

Welcome

Mr. Rogers welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Commissioner Quarles is attending the 61st Annual They're Off! Luncheon to kick off the Kentucky Derby with local food sourced by KDA.

Mr. Rogers referenced the 2017 Hemp Program is receiving hemp seed imports with some seed being planted.

Mr. Rogers discussed new hires and appointments within KDA.

KADB Meeting 1 April 21, 2017

Approval of Minutes

Mr. Rogers entertained a motion to approve the minutes of the March 17, 2017 board meeting.

Dr. Bailey moved to approve the minutes, as presented; Mr. Foree seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion Passed; Unanimous.

Executive Director's Report

Mr. Rogers yielded the floor to Warren Beeler, Executive Director, to report to the board.

Mr. Beeler announced that the 2017 MSA Tobacco payment has been received with a total amount of \$93,415,537.55, approximately \$4.4 million over the Consensus Forecasting Group (CFG) estimate.

Mr. Beeler called on Aleta Botts, Executive Director, KCARD, to update the board on the activities of the organization.

Mr. Beeler called on Dr. Chad Lee, Director, UK Grain and Forage Center of Excellence, to update the board on the status of the center.

Mr. Beeler yielded the floor to Dr. Pomper. He announced the memorial Harold R. Benson Agricultural Luncheon on Thursday, May 4 and invited board members to attend.

Mr. Beeler updated the board on the activities of the GOAP since the March 17, 2017 board meeting.

Deputy Executive Director's Report

Mr. Rogers yielded the floor to Bill McCloskey, GOAP Deputy Executive Director, to report to the board.

2017 Farmers Market Guidelines

Mr. Doan presented a memorandum *(on file)* regarding the approved 2017 Farmers Market guidelines. Staff recommended removing the funding guideline for market managers to prevent duplication of services provided by another KADF supported program. This change will become effective immediately.

Dean Cox moved to approve the request, as presented; Mr. Pedigo seconded the motion.

A2015-0008 Lexington Fayette Urban County Government

Mr. McCloskey presented a memorandum *(on file)* regarding the above-referenced project. This is a request for a 6-month no-cost time extension.

After discussion, Mr. Mahan moved to approve the request, as presented; Dean Cox seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion Passed; with dissention.

A2015-0028 Atalo Holdings, Inc.

Mr. Baker presented a memorandum *(on file)* regarding the above-referenced project. This is a request for a 6-month no-cost time extension.

Mr. Mahan moved to approve the request, with the condition that this will be the last extension request; Mr. Pedigo seconded the motion.

Programs Recommended for Approval²

Mr. Rogers called on Mr. McCloskey to present programs recommended for approval.

Mr. McCloskey referenced twelve (12) County Agricultural Investment Program (CAIP) applications requesting county funds totaling \$1,580,255; three (3) Deceased Farm Animal Removal Program applications requesting county funds totaling \$14,000; one (1) Shared-Use Equipment Program application requesting county funds totaling \$34,567; and six (6) Youth Cost-Share Program applications requesting county funds totaling \$137,700. Total program funding requested was \$1,766,522.

VOTE: Motion Passed; Mr. Hughes abstained.

Project Recommendations for Funding

Mr. Rogers called on Mr. McCloskey and Mr. Doan to present the following recommendations for funding:

A2017-0017 Louisville/Jefferson County Metro Government

Mr. McCloskey referenced the above application from Louisville/Jefferson County Metro Government requesting \$100,000 over two years to support its Farm to Table program.

The Red Application Review Committee recommended funding the request for up to \$100,000 in State funds, subject to terms and conditions.

Mr. Foree moved to approve the committee recommendation; Mr. Hughes seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion Passed; Unanimous.

A2017-0020 Crowley's Mill, LLC

Mr. Doan referenced the above application from Crowley's Mill, LLC requesting \$150,000 in State funds and \$100,000 in multiple County funds to relocate an operating fiber mill to process hemp, wool and other natural fibers.

The Red Application Review Committee recommended funding the request for up to \$245,000 in State and County funds, subject to terms and conditions.

Mr. Henderson moved to approve the committee recommendation; Mr. Hughes seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion Passed; Mr. Mattingly abstained.

A2017-0021 Taylor County Board of Education

Mr. McCloskey referenced the above application from the Taylor County Board of Education requesting \$15,000 in Taylor County funds for the construction of a greenhouse on the Taylor County High School campus.

The Red Application Review Committee recommended funding the request for up to \$15,000 in Taylor County funds, subject to terms and conditions.

Mr. Moore moved to approve the committee recommendation; Mr. Warner seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion Passed; Unanimous.

A2017-0023 Nicholasville Farmers' Market, Inc.

Mr. Doan referenced the above application from Nicholasville Farmers' Market, Inc. requesting \$3,000 in Jessamine County funds and \$1,904 in State funds for market manager salary, advertising and other farmers market essentials.

The Red Application Review Committee recommended funding the request for up to \$3,000 in Jessamine County funds for marketing and vendor development, subject to terms and conditions.

Mr. Warner moved to approve the committee recommendation; Dr. Jones seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion Passed; Unanimous.

A2017-0025 American Black Hereford Association

Mr. McCloskey referenced the above application from the American Black Hereford Association requesting \$50,000 in State funds and \$50,000 in multiple county funds as a grant to establish its official headquarters in Lexington, Kentucky.

The Red Application Review Committee recommended funding the request for up to \$100,000 in State and County funds, subject to terms and conditions.

Dr. Jones expressed concern for lack of producer impact for this project.

Mr. Mattingly explained the committee's reasons for the terms and conditions, and its belief that this is an economic development project.

Mr. McCloskey clarified that state funds will not be utilized until county funds are committed.

Mr. Mahan acknowledged Dr. Jones's comment and stated that the project has potential to benefit producers in the state.

Mr. Mahan moved to approve the committee recommendation; Mr. Warner seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion Passed; Dr. Jones opposed.

A2017-0026 Russell County Conservation District

Mr. Doan referenced the above application from the Russell County Conversation District requesting \$4,250 in Russell County funds to purchase grain bin rescue equipment.

The Red Application Review Committee recommended funding the request for up to \$4,250 in Russell County funds, subject to terms and conditions.

Mr. Henderson moved to approve the committee recommendation; Mr. Mattingly seconded the motion.

VOTE: Motion Passed; Unanimous.

A2017-0038 Hopkins county Board of Education

Mr. Doan referenced the above application from the Hopkins County Board of Education requesting \$4,000 in Hopkins County funds for the improvements to the greenhouse at Madisonville North Hopkins High School.

The Red Application Review Committee recommended funding the request for up to \$4,000 in Hopkins County funds, subject to terms and conditions.

Mr. Mattingly moved to approve the committee recommendation; Mr. Pedigo seconded the motion.

Mr. McCauley encouraged board members to visit the FDA website and comment on the smokeless tobacco rule.

Mr. Rogers announced that Angela Blank, KDA Director, Division of Public Relations, accepted a communications position with the Kentucky Tourism, Arts and Heritage Cabinet.

Mr. Rogers stated that the next KADB meeting is on May 19, 2017 at the Franklin County Extension Office in Frankfort, Ky.
